Untamed and wild, Zululand is claimed by game parks and eco-reserves teaming with life. Extensive tracts of bush abut coastal stretches of swamp and vegetated dunes. Woodland forests open up onto lakes and rivers, and sandy beaches flow into seas and lagoons. Zululand is vitally alive, from the smallest creature seen on nature hikes, to the big tusker elephants which sway through the parks, disdainful of excited human onlookers. Nature conservation is of prime importance here, and some of the world's most endangered species are carefully protected and nurtured. The area's biodiversity offers both water and land-based game experiences, providing a uniquely well-rounded safari which includes big 5, marine and wetlands animals.

The Hluhluwe-iMfolozi National Park is home to a healthy population of highly endangered black and white rhino and at iSimangaliso Wetland Park, Leatherback and Loggerhead turtles can be witnessed laying their eggs on the very beaches from which they hatched many years before. The turtle's ability to navigate back to their place of birth is still a source of wonder in the world of science. World Heritage Site, iSimangaliso offers supreme diving, a variety of ecological zones and claims the world's highest vegetated dunes. Zululand's private reserves afford both luxury and a top safari experience.

The region is grounded in the culture and traditions of its people, dating back to feared warrior king, Shaka, and visitors can experience the warm hospitality of the locals, explore traditional villages and enjoy a tasty meal while listening to harmonious singing.

Rhino Sands Safari Camp is located on a peninsula of the Msunduze River, within the Manyoni Private Game Reserve. The camp is nestled within riverine forests, built on wooden platforms and under canvas. 4 luxurious tented suites have a traditional east African style, classical elegant décor and all the modern conveniences for superb comfort. Each suite has an attractive living area, en-suite bathroom and an outdoor shower. They open out onto private decks with a pool and beautiful riverbed views. Central guest spaces include a casual bar, lounges, dining areas and a large boma for fireside meals under starry skies. Day and night game drives are conducted through the reserve in search of the animals which call the region home – big 5 game as well as wild dog, cheetah and a variety of smaller animals.

Welcome to Durban...

A multi-cultural fusion, Durban combines its variety of customs and flavours into a vibrant city abounding in energy. Both an important port and a laid-back surfing mecca, Durban blends unique and arty with business-oriented and fast-paced. The Art-deco, Indian and Colonial architecture bears evidence to the influences which have helped create this fascinating hub. Museums display collections of tribal artefacts and offer insights into the city's past and the apartheid era which tore the country apart.

Discover the surrounding townships with their spaza shops, local foods and traditions, and the Zulu customs so much a part of the provinces' heritage. Move from the intoxicating fragrances of the spicy foods at the crowded city bazaar, market and town centre, to the fresh breezes of Durban's beachfront and swimming beaches.

A striking landmark and tribute to the Soccer World Cup, the Moses Mabhida Stadium, is carved into the Durban landscape and from the heights of the SkyCar, visitors can obtain panoramic views over the city. The coastline stretches out in front of the stadium. Popular beaches exude surfer vibes and offer the chance to mingle with the locals, while further along the Golden Mile is the home to an impressive array of marine life, uShaka Marine Park. To the north, the village of Umhlanga glistens in the sun, a shining jewel of beaches, walkways, restaurants and shops.

Greenmarket Square's local crafts markets and the Bo-Kaap's colourful Cape Malay buildings add a sense of authenticity to your trip, and Long Street's vibrant restaurants, bars and clubs come alive after dark. Perhaps wander around the Victoria and Alfred Waterfront, a working harbour and hub of entertainment and shopping opportunities.

Tuesday 07 May 19

Cape Point & Peninsula: Private Full Day

Travel along the Atlantic Seaboard via Sea Point, Clifton and Camps Bay, to Hout Bay, a quaint village and fishing harbour with magnificent mountain views and beach. Continue via Chapman's Peak, one of the world's most breath-taking coastal drives, to the Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve and Cape Point which is perceived to be the meeting point of the Atlantic and Indian Oceans. Go on to historic Simon's Town, a village with charming Victorian architecture, a naval base and a large penguin colony at the beautiful Boulders Beach. Boulders Penguin Colony is home to a growing colony of the vulnerable African Penguin. Wooden walkways allow visitors to view the

penguins in their natural habitat and there is also a new information centre.

A lunch stop is made nearby (lunch to own account). End the day with a visit to the well-known Kirstenbosch National Botanical Gardens. The Garden includes five of South Africa's six different biomes and is world-renowned for the beauty and diversity of the Cape Flora it displays as well as for the magnificence of its setting against the eastern slopes of Table Mountain. The tour ends at \pm 17:30 with drop-off at your hotel.

Wednesday 08 May 19

Cape Town City Tour: Private Half Day

The tour commences with a tour of Table Mountain (weather permitting; cable car fee not included). Enjoy panoramic views over the Mother City and the Atlantic Seaboard with Robben Island in the distance lying sleepily in Table Bay harbour. In the city itself, stop at the Company Gardens. Enjoy a walk throughthe garden and a visit to the South AfricanMuseum. This is followed by a visit to the Castle of Good Hope. Built between 1666 and 1679 by the Dutch East India Company (VOC) as a maritime replenishment station, the Castle of Good Hope is the oldest surviving colonial building in South Africa. The drive through the city centre would also take you past the Houses of Parliament, the Grand Parade and City Hall from where Nelson Mandela first addressed South Africans after his release in February 1990. Return to your hotel upon completion of the tour.

Winelands Tour: Private Full Day

This delightful drive winds its way to the heart of the Cape Winelands, through superb mountain ranges, vineyards and Cape Dutch homesteads.

Head off to the wine country via the N2 to the heart of South Africa's wine industry, Stellenbosch, boasting great beauty and culture that is steeped in South African history. Walk down the canal-lined avenues, in the shade of giant oak trees and beautifully preserved historic buildings. With the sheer vastness of wine estates on offer, we are truly spoilt for choice when we enjoy our first wine tasting of the day at the Waterford Estate or similar.

Travel over the Helshoogte Pass to the town of Franschhoek, historically dating back to the 17th century when the French Huguenots arrived. Billed as the Gourmet Capital of South Africa, this charming town, in a most picturesque valley, retains a French Huguenot style.

We enjoy a wine tasting before taking time to enjoy the fabled culinary skills of the Franschhoek chefs at one of the many award winning restaurants (lunch not included in cost).

Onward to Paarl, one of the Cape's first farming districts. The town is set at the foot of the cluster of remarkable granite domes from which it takes its name.

Our last stop for the day is at a wine estate on the Paarl wine route.

We return to the bustle of city life after an enthralling day in the countryside, arriving back at the hotels at approximately 17:30

The Winelands is all about stepping back from the hectic pace of modern living, and appreciating the finer things in life in some of the most gorgeous and tranquil locations this country has to offer.

Avondrood Guest House is a historic Cape Dutch homestead, located in the Wineland's village of Franschhoek. Built in 1870, the house retains its Victorian charm and boasts interiors with a contemporary elegance. 8 rooms are individually decorated for comfort and the family room features an upstairs verandah and mountain views. Breakfast is served on the patio, or in the lounge, and guests can stroll to the town centre to take advantage of the gourmet restaurants and cafes for which Franschhoek is renowned. Wine Tram: Hop-on Hop-off tour

Approximately 3 to 6 hours depending on number of stops (excluding transfer time)

Please note:

- Tickets need to be collected from the Ticket Office at least 15 minutes prior to departure. Should you miss your scheduled departure time there is no guarantee that there will be space on the next departure
- The tram or tram-bus passes each stop once an hour. Should you wish to stay longer than 1 hour at any farm this is possible but would mean that you will forfeit another Estate
- The service operates in one direction and once you pass a Wine Estate you cannot go back
- Wine that is bought during the tour can be given to a conductor and will be available for collection at the Ticket Office at the end of

your journey

• You must hop-off at least at 2 of the wine estates on the bus before moving on to the tram section with the 10.30 and 11.30 departures

The Franschhoek Wine Tram hop-on hop-off tour is one of the best ways to discover the true essence of the Franschhoek Valley – picturesque vineyards, breath-taking scenery, warm hospitality, world-class cuisine, fine wines and a 300 year history.

Passengers on board the hop-on hop-off tour experience a unique and leisurely way to see the Franschhoek Valley as they journey through rolling vineyards in an open-side tram and open-air tram-bus stopping in at some of South Africa's oldest and most distinguished wine estates.

A combination of tram and tram-bus transports passengers around a loop of stops allowing them to hop-off at each stop and experience the activities on offer, be it wine tasting, a cellar tour, lunch or simply a stroll through the vineyards and when they are ready, hop-on to continue the tour.

The experience takes passengers right into the heart of the Franschhoek Valley, with a narration focusing on the history of Franschhoek and wine cultivation in the valley, complimentary wine tastings and unparalleled views of the valley and vineyards.
