Leopard, Rhinoceros, Chimpanzee
and Gorilla

Our unique position on the continent means we have both savannah species typical of East Africa (lion, elephant, buffalo, giraffe, zebra, warthog etc.), and forest species more typical of Central Africa (forest elephant, red river hog, chimpanzee, mountain gorilla, forest buffalo).



More about **Uganda**

-  Right at the heart of Africa, where the East African savannah meets the Central African rainforest
-  Largest fresh water lake in Africa which is roughly the size of Ireland
-  Uganda is approx. 241,038 km², around the same size as Germany
-  Home to 54 % of all the mountain gorillas in the world
-  With more than 56 tribes, Uganda is a cultural melting pot



More about **Uganda**

-  One of the safest countries in Africa
-  Over 1060 bird species, which is more than in USA and Canada combined
-  The Nile, the longest river in the world starts from Uganda on its way to Alexandria, in Egypt, where it ends in the Mediterranean
-  With 28 lakes and many more rivers, water covers 15 % of Uganda

Murchison Falls National Park

The biggest NP in Uganda, hosting 76 species of mammals and 451 birds. The most powerful waterfall in the world – the Mighty Nile - river squeezes through a narrow 8m gap with a total height of 45m.

What to do?


- Hike to the top of the falls

Bwindi Impenetrable Forest National Park

South - Western Uganda

Gazetted as a National Park in 1991
and declared a UNESCO Natural
World Heritage Site in 1994
One of the world's oldest and most
biologically diverse rainforest
Home to roughly half of the world's
population of gorilla

- Buniga forest walk and the Batwa
Community of Sanurio
- Gorilla Tracking

Rwanda

Rwanda is land locked country in east-central Africa.

Approximately 26,338 km² is slightly smaller than Belgium.

Rwanda is highly elevated and is dominated by mountains in the west and savannah to the east, with numerous lakes throughout the country.

3 National Parks : Volcanoes, Akagera and Nyungwe

Around **400 gorillas** left in Rwanda.

Most famous attractions: mountain gorilla tracking, nature walks, volcano climbing/ hiking
